153-Prohibiting autos from crossing parallel white lines on certain highways, primer sponsor
Signed by Governor Langlie
425-Establishing the state board for volunteer firemen to administer the volunteer firemen's relief fund
Signed by Governor Langlie
449-Amending the firemen's relief and pension act, prime sponsor
Went to second reading
464-Establishing a state merit system of personnel administration
Went to first reading
701-Establishing the state personnel board
Went to first reading

4-Providing for 120 day odd year and 30 day even year legislative sessions Went to first reading
