• First appointed to the House of Representatives to serve the remainder of the unexpired term after the death of her husband, Jurie B. Smith, on November 9, 1942. Jurie Smith served for five regular and one special sessions of the Washington Legislature, 1933- 1942, and has been described as "the leader of the progressive bloc, often referred to as the Democratic Left Wing. Mr. Smith's leadership had a gentle quality which did not depend upon threats of reprisals. He seldom raised voice even in the midst of debate. Know as a master strategist, he ruled with an air of gentle benignity a group that often became vociferous." (Gilbert, J.W.)
