278-Relating to minimum wages of school teachers

380-Relating to the licensing and supervision of rest homes, nursing homes, homes for aged, ill persons and children, and similar institutions; prescribing the duties of officers in connection therewith; fixing fees; providing for appeals from certain decisions; defining offenses and providing penalties; and declaring an emergency

Reported out of committee and died

382-Relating to the establishment and maintaining at the University of Washington of a College of Drugless Therapeutics, creating a Board of Control, prescribing its power and duties, providing for appointment of its members, fixing their term of office and compensation, providing for payment of expenses in relation thereto, and repealing conflicting acts Went to first reading
